At Bedford Primary School we have Guided Reading sessions for 30 minutes at least four times a week in years 2 to 6. Year 1 complete three 20 minute sessions a week outside of their phonic sessions.

In each year group a wide range of different texts have been chosen carefully. Each year group has ensured a variety of text types ensuring a variety of:

- Fiction
- Non Fiction
- Poetry
- Song Lyrics

Our Guided Reading Curriculum supports learning in English writing sessions and the Wider Curriculum subjects.

We have developed a diverse reading curriculum that ensures pupils have access to high-quality and challenging texts which support pupils to become confident readers and allow them to succeed in life.



guided reading skills



Pupils will work on a number of different skills in each session including:

- Speaking and Listening
- Focussed discussions
- Decoding unfamiliar words
- Understanding meanings of unfamiliar words and phrases
- Understanding Author intent and discussing the impact of specific words or phrases
- Using background knowledge to help understanding
- Reading for meaning
- Summarising
- Prediction
- Vocabulary
- Understanding of text structure
- Inference
- Comprehension
- Making links between texts and author's work



Staff use the Scarborough Reading Rope during Guided Reading sessions to support them with planning the sessions.

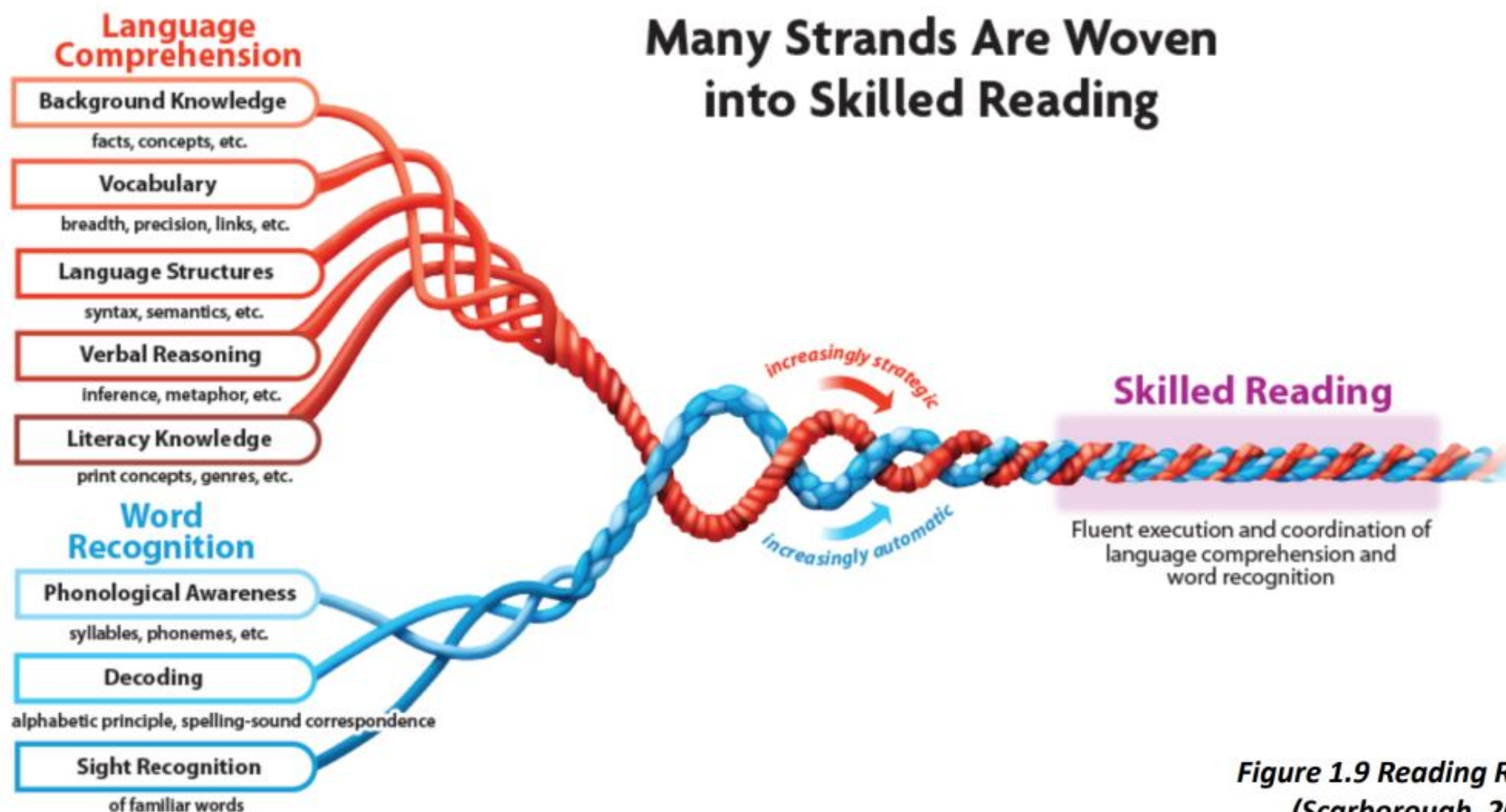


Figure 1.9 Reading Rope
